Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

As required by Section 1901.14 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Rocky River Municipal Court herewith submits its Annual Report for 2002. The contents of this report are based on data assembled and tabulated by William E. Gareau, Clerk of Court, and his staff. The following data are noteworthy for the year 2002.

- 1. The total funds received from all sources in the year 2002 amounted to \$5,594,277.87, a decrease of \$402,669.44 from 2001.
- 2. The total number of criminal/traffic cases filed in 2002 was 32,422. The statistical breakdown includes 28,233 traffic, 846 DUI/BAC, 2416 misdemeanors, 458 felonies and 469 parking violations. The total criminal/traffic case filings were down 3,313 cases from 2001.
- 3. The civil/small claims case filings for 2002 were 2,347. The statistical breakdown includes 1,558 civil cases and 781 small claims cases. The total civil/small claims case filings were up 198 cases over 2001.
- 4. The total amount of court costs disbursed to the City of Rocky River in 2002 from all sources amounted to \$2,697,776.39 a decrease of \$216,270.76 from 2001. Of these funds, \$375,112.50 were placed in a special Computer Fund set up by the Court on January 1, 1996. In addition, \$374,688.00 were placed in a Special Project Fund established by the Court on January 1, 1999. The money in these funds will be used to enhance the Court's computer system and pay off the debt of the new Courthouse. Also, \$46,613 was placed in the Court's Probation Fund. The monies in all of these funds are not available for operational costs.

After seven straight years of increased caseloads the court district saw a 10% decrease in criminal/traffic cases, and a 9% increase in civil cases. The Court has no control over how many cases are filed each year, this is determined by enforcement priorities of the Cities within the district. Civil cases usually fluctuate within this percentage from year to year.

During the year 2002, the old Rocky River Memorial Hall was raised and replaced by the new Rocky River Municipal Courthouse. Construction began with the groundbreaking on March 1, 2002. We are preparing to move into this new facility on the weekend of February 15, 2003. The new Court will have 24,720 square feet of space compared to less than 10,000 square feet of space in the City Hall complex, 6,000 of which doubles as City Council Chambers.

I want to thank the staff of the Clerk's Office for their hard work and dedication during the year. Special thanks is given to Chief Deputy Clerk Deborah Comery who was given responsibility for compiling this report. I would also like to thank Presiding/Administrative Judge Donna Congeni Fitzsimmons, Judge Maureen Adler Gravens and their staffs for their help and guidance during the year. Finally, appreciation is extended to Rocky River Mayor William Knoble, Rocky River City Council, Police Officers, and Officials of the Rocky River Court District for their assistance.






